*Monday, February 10, at 4:30 PM*

### **BIG Architects' New Headquarters**

In 2023, Bjarke Ingels Group (BIG) inaugurated a newly built, seven-story headquarters located at the very tip of Sundmolen. We have been invited inside for a tour of the spectacular building—of course, designed by BIG, Denmark's most internationally renowned architectural firm.

## MARCH 2025

### **The Artist House in Classensgade**

The Artist House in Classensgade is a studio collective for 23 professional and academically trained artists. It is the only artist-owned house of its kind and size in Denmark. We will be given a tour, including an introduction to the house's history, a visit to the workshops, and a meeting with some of the resident artists (some of whom have works owned by CBS).

## APRIL 2025

### **Copenhagen Contemporary**

We will visit two exhibitions at Copenhagen Contemporary. First, we will have a guided tour of *Intensify Life* by Marta Minujín. Afterwards, we can explore *Are You a Living Thing That is Dying, or a Dying Thing That is Living?* by Emma Talbot. Those interested will have an opportunity to dine at Reffen afterward.

## MAY 2025

### **Art Association's General Meeting**

Before the general meeting, art historian Flemming Friberg Jensen will give a lecture (topic to be announced). He was the director of Ny Carlsberg Glyptotek from 2002 to 2017 and is now a postdoc at CBS. Immediately following the general meeting, the artworks purchased throughout the year will be raffled, including pieces by artists who have exhibited at CBS in the past year.

*Wednesday, May 28, at 4:00 PM*

### **Designmuseum Danmark**

The exhibition TRYKKRAFT presents textiles by Denmark's greatest textile printers throughout history, alongside new works by some of today's most talented textile artists. The exhibition highlights an overlooked aspect of Danish arts and design. This is the first time the museum's extensive collection of Danish textile prints is being presented on such a large scale.

## JUNE 2025

### **Full-Day Trip to Roskilde**

This year's major bus tour takes us to Roskilde, where we will visit the current exhibition at the Museum of Contemporary Art, have lunch at the café in Sct. Hans Have, and take a guided walk along Roskilde's Cultural Route to see 20 public art installations. If possible, we will also visit Roskilde Cathedral to view some fine, recent paintings.

## AUGUST 2025

### **Walking Tour of the Old Green Market in Valby**

The former wholesale Green Market in Valby, which since 1958 has been a trading hub for fruit, vegetable, and flower merchants, has been transformed into a new, modern district with over 3,000 homes. We will take a guided tour of the area, featuring new art installations.

## SEPTEMBER 2025

### **Kastrupgårdsamlingen**

We will take a guided tour of MED TRYK PÅ by HuskMitNavn. With his characteristic style and satirical linework referencing popular culture, HuskMitNavn uses his art to interpret and reveal new meanings in our everyday surroundings. His works often depict marginalized or overlooked people in everyday situations, reflecting a reality that is part of our world.

## OCTOBER 2025

*Tuesday, September 30 – Saturday, October 4*

### **Art Trip to The Hague and Rotterdam**

In 2025, we are planning an art trip to the Netherlands, with a special focus on museums, galleries, and other artistic and architectural experiences in The Hague and Rotterdam. Highlights include Mauritshuis in The Hague, which houses world-famous paintings by Vermeer and Rembrandt.

A more detailed description of the trip will soon be sent out, allowing for non-binding expressions of interest to assess whether we should proceed with the planning.

### **Thoravej 29 & Gallery Crawl**

We will visit a community that embraces diversity and aims to create positive change for people and society. ### **Danske Bank's New Headquarters**

Danske Bank has built a large and impressive new headquarters. While Danske Bank may not immediately bring fine culture and art to mind, they have nevertheless accumulated a rather significant art collection over the years—smartly curated and displayed throughout the new building for the enjoyment of employees and daily visitors. On this day, we will receive a thorough presentation of both the architectural ideas behind the building's design and the artistic background of the collection.

## DECEMBER 2025

Here, we will see the exhibition *Banksy & Street Art: The Early Years*, which provides a fascinating and revealing insight into Banksy's early working methods and creative processes.
